


Message from the Regional Director


The Fall Tour to Shipshewana was a wonderful outing! Thanks to Dan & Darlene Sobczyk and

Trivia

The name "taxicab" is derived from the two words, "taximeter" and "cabriolet". The former was invented in 1891 and is used to record distances and calculate the fare. The latter refers to a horse drawn carriage where the



driver stands in the back of the carriage.

The name "taximeter" itself is derived from the Mid-Latin "taxa", meaning "tax, charge".

Studebaker

Studebaker Brothers Manufacturing Company became the world's largest manufacturer of wagons and buggies, entering the automobile market in 1902 with an electric car. The second electric car they produced was purchased by Thomas Edison.


While South Bend retained the horse-drawn vehicle trade, the auto manufacturing was moved to Detroit, eventually returning back to it's Indiana roots.

In 1907, Studebaker acquired Tincher Motor Company but ceased production in 1908, making it so rare a car there is believed to be only one in existence.

Like other manufacturers, during the war years they supplied the Allied forces with trucks. 'Studebaker' became Russian slang for truck, they were so abundant.

Studebaker also produced 'The Weasel' - an all terrain vehicle that the military eventually came to rely heavily upon, By the end of the war 15,000 had been built.

Studebaker became the first company to produce a post-war automobile. "First by far with a postwar car" became their advertising line.





Both are fascinating!










An outstanding dinner at a custom made table for 30 people! Black raspberry cream and pecan pies for dessert - I think we ALL ate too much!

The founder of the museum, Eldon Hostetler, was on hand to autograph copies of his book. Several people purchased copies, including Chuck Derer.



Hudson Terraplane

Originally branded the Essex-Terraplane, both cars and trucks branded Terraplane were manufactured between 1932 and 1938.

Amelia Earhart introduced the car in 1932 amid much fanfare and a parade of 2000 of them, reportedly the biggest industrial celebration ever staged in Detroit. For her endorsement she was given one to keep. The car she originally christened was later given to Orville Wright.

Ms Earhart also announced an Amelia Earhart trophy race for woman fliers at the National air races in Cleveland that same year - the first prize being a brand new Hudson Essex Terraplane.

The 8-cylinder cars were believed to have the highest horsepower-to-weight ratio of any production automobiles in the world, and were favored by John Dillinger and Baby Face Nelson for their acceleration,

handling and discreet appearance.

Terraplanes later were also built outside the U.S. in England and Australia.




ENTER OFF OF EUCLID AVENUE
