


#### **Board Notes**

As it does every year, this prestigious event offers car enthusiasts a diverse assortment of classic, special


interest, and antique vehicles to admire. Free to the public, the streets of Geneva were packed as usual despite the uncomfortable late August heat.





Saturday's stops included a tour of the Kokomo Opalescent Glass Company, the Elwood Haynes Museum and the Seiberling Mansion. The


