

Have a car to sell? The internet has become the easiest and most common way to sell a classic car. Creating an effective classic car sale ad doesn't have to be difficult.

1. Remember: a picture paints a thousand words so include lots of good quality photos of your classic car, preferably from multiple angles, and don't forget to include photos of the interior.

2. Write a detailed description. The more detailed your ad is, the less time you will waste answering questions later. You'll also find yourself receiving more inquiries because a detailed description makes your ad appear very trustworthy.

3. Keep things honest. People will want to know *why* you're selling the car.

4. Avoid cliches. Nobody believes things like "This car was only driven by a little old lady to church on Sundays".

### Tech Tip

When attempting to insert brass grub screws that a magnetic screw driver will not hold and fingers cannot grip, stick the slotted end into a short piece of clear plastic tubing. The tubing provides sufficient grip to turn the screw to start it, and can be long enough so fingers are out of the way. Once the grub screw has been started, a screwdriver can tighten the screw.




### News and Notes


All this talk about self-parking cars...it's not new. In 1933, Packard came out with a self-parking car.

The fifth wheel (spare tire) is lowered by a hydraulic cylinder, apparently driven from a hydraulic pump in the engine compartment. Once the rear wheels of the car are up off the ground, a drum contacts the left rear wheel.

This drum is on an axle that connects to another drum contacting the fifth wheel. The driver puts the car in gear and by carefully releasing the clutch can "drive the car" (actually swing the rear of the car around) into the parking space. Similarly, he can also swing the car back out of the space by using a reverse gear, but we all know that getting a car out of a parking space is often a lot easier than getting it into the space.







#### From Auto Park to Auto Pilot

A driver on a Connecticut interstate reportedly set his Tesla on Autopilot to check on his dog in the back seat when the vehicle hit two stopped cars on the side of Interstate 90 - one of which happened to be a police cruiser. Yes, the Tesla driver was ticketed.

### New Record Set

In November, a new record was set for cross country driving. Three car enthusiasts drove 2800 miles from New York City to Redondo Beach, CA in an unbelievable 27 hours and 25 minutes, at speeds up to 193 mph. The car was a Mercedes, modified over two years specifically for this run. Using radar detectors, CB radios, police scanners, binoculars, a thermal scope on the car's roof, and a team of spotters who drove ahead of them reporting on road conditions. And police cars no doubt.


