





Behind the Scenes - Gems/Gems on Wheels



The visit to the Lizzadro Museum of Lapidary Art was truly a 'gem'. The museum displays over 200 pieces of jade and other hard stone carvings from around the world, some modern and some antique. Other prime examples of lapidary art are snuff bottles, many decorative and functional items, and dioramas, which were carved in Idar-Oberstein, Germany. The Museum's collection also features beautiful examples of Florentine and Roman stone mosaics, cameos and intaglios.

Lunch was within walking distance at the College - the Alma Mater of more than one group member. Cafeteria style, but definitely NOT your standard cafeteria fare, there was a variety of well-prepared offerings - all quite tasty. It was also the perfect opportunity to sit around and chat with other members on tour. After lunch everyone was welcome to go their own way. Some opted to go back to the Lizzadro Museum, some made a stop at the greenhouse which was bursting with color and the scent of lilies, and a few other persistent souls pressed on to the Elmhurst historical Museum in the imposing Glos Mansion. 
