Editor's Corner





Everyone who has owned collector car has stories. What's one of your favorites?

We were returning from a car meet with our 1946 Bentley Mark VI and broke down just outside of Indianapolis. As we were waiting on the side of the road for AAA to arrive, a young man wearing a torn t-shirt and driving a beat-up Toyota pick-up stopped. He asked if we needed help and seemed like a nice chap despite his appearance, so we agreed. He lifted the bonnet, took one look, and said our water pump was broken. Michelle had a feeling that might have been the problem as it was "spitting" earlier. The young man turned out to be a mechanic for Mercedes-Benz! When the AAA flatbed arrived, they picked up the Bentley and, because it was a Sunday and no dealers were open, hauled it to the personal garage of the AAA franchisee where the car stayed until Monday. The car was then hauled to a Bentley dealership in Zionville, IN



where a rebuilt water pump was installed. It goes to show you how helpful and welcoming car enthusiasts are.

What is your first memory of connecting with cars?

When I was a little boy, my uncle was chauffeur to Lord St. Oswald, who had Bentleys and Rolls-Royce cars, mostly Bentleys. My uncle and aunt lived in the London Mews, above the garages where Lord St. Oswald stored his automobiles. We would often get a chance to ride in the Bentleys when my uncle had to deliver them to Lord St. Oswald's country estate.

What was your first love affair with a car, and did you ever buy it?

Members In The News - Joe Bortz

After 35 years, the Virgil Exner 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon concept car from the Joe Bortz Auto Collection will again be featured at the 2025 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance.

Joe Bortz thanks Sandra Button, Pebble Beach Concours Chairman, for the invitation to show the Virgil Exner 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon concept car in the 2025 special class designated for "Virgil Exner Idea Cars".

Many say that the 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon is considered to be one of the best of all Virgil Exner designs. Some may recall that the 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon was one of the first ever post war concept cars ever shown at Pebble Beach on the back lawn behind the "lodge" circa 1990. Joe Bortz also exhibited his concept cars at Pebble Beach as a special feature in 1989-1990.

The 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon has been in the Joe

Bortz Auto Collection for over 40 years. The Falcon was built as a fully running and driving concept car - constructed on a production 1955 Chrysler 300 chassis that was shortened. The shorter chassis was then sent to the Carrozzeria Ghia body building company in Turin, Italy to fabricate Exner's vision of the 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon roadster concept car design.

The 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon is powered by a 331 c.i. Fire Power HEMI V8 with 300 HP with a Power Flite Automatic Transmission, power steering, power brakes and power windows.

For its day, this 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon pushed the limits of automobile design and power. Many say had it been put into production, it could have had a huge impact on the sales of the other two Detroit 2-seaters, the 1955 Ford Thunderbird and the 1955 Chevrolet Corvette. There were only two 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcons built by Ghia and the second one has never been found although Joe is still looking for it.

Virgil Exner Sr designed the famous "Forward Look" cars for Chrysler between 1955-1963. He was considered one of the finest hands on post war artistic American designers of "Idea Cars" from the sketch pad to the completed vehicle. It is interesting to note that the only brass model that Virgil Exner Sr kept on his desk from 1955 to 1963 was that of the 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon according to Virgil Exner Jr.

Joe Bortz was quoted as saying, "No one should miss this great opportunity to personally see all of Virgil Exner Sr's great Ghia concept cars including the 1955 Chrysler Ghia Falcon this year on Sunday, August 17, 2025 at the fabulous Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance".



The Classic Car Club of America defines a Full Classic as a "Fine" or "Distinctive" automobile. American or foreign built, produced only between 1915 and 1948. Many factors come into play but, generally, a Classic was a high-priced, top end vehicle when new and was built in limited quantities. No "Mass produced" assembly line vehicles are considered Classics. Other factors, including higher engine displacement, custom bespoke coachwork and luxury accessories. Mechanical developments such as power brakes, power clutch, and "one-shot" or automatic lubrication systems, help determine whether a car is considered to be a Classic.

Only certain models of some vehicles built during 1915 through 1948 are recognized as CCCA Classics: Be sure to check the list of recognized cars to see if all models of a particular marque are accepted as Full Classic cars. Application may be made for Full Classic consideration by applying to the National CCCA Classification committee.
