



The guest speaker was Charles Taylor, son of Reuben and Emily Taylor and great grandson of Charles Taylor who built the engine for the Wright Brothers airplane. He had interesting stories, lots of photos and afterwards signed posters and copies of a book on his great grandfather.

Tom Roche stepped down as Director and was presented with an award for his service. Other awards were also given to Reuben and Emily Taylor (Couple of the year) and to James Kleinschmidt for his service as past Director.

The Guest Speaker was Charles Taylor, son of Reuben and Emily Taylor. He gave a presentation on his great grandfather, also named Charles Taylor, who built the first aircraft engine used by the Wright Brothers.

Originally hired by the Wright Brothers to repair bicycles in their bike shop, Charlie was a good mechanic and the Wrights turned to Taylor when they needed the right engine for their 'flyer'.

In 1908 Taylor helped Orville build and prepare a "military Flyer" for demonstration to the U.S. Army at Fort Myer, Virginia. The airplane crashed and Taylor thought he had killed Orville. Seriously injured, Orville survived, but his passenger, Army lieutenant Thomas Selfridge was killed. Fate was on Taylor's side that day. Not only did Orville survive, but Taylor and Navy Lieutenant George Sweet had been scheduled to make their first flights that day but were bumped in favor of Selfridge who had to leave for Missouri.

Despite this accident, Taylor wanted to become a pilot and wanted Wilbur and Orville to teach him. The Wrights, reluctant to lose Taylor's


services to the world of exhibition flying, discouraged him. Taylor became a leading mechanic in the Wright Company after it was formed in 1909.

Eventually, in 1936, Charlie and Orville helped Henry Ford in the planning, moving and restoration of the Wright family home and the Wright Brothers bicycle shop to Ford's Dearborn, Michigan heritage village.

Charles Taylor is buried at the Portal of Folded Wings Shrine to Aviation in Burbank, California, a shrine to aviation history.




