

Marleah was an accomplished pianist, organist and piano teacher. She served in executive roles at the Girl Scouts of DuPage County, Lincoln National Life Insurance Company (serving as the first female president of the DuPage Life Insurance Association) and at the Colonial Bank and Trust. She also founded and led the Executive Women of DuPage County organization. Marleah started the MK Johnson insurance agency, owned and operated several highly successful diet centers in the Chicago area and later partnered with her husband, Bud, as co-owner and operator of Schweppe Used Food Service Equipment. Marleah was also an intrepid world traveler and an accomplished painter. She is survived by her loving husband, Bud, 2 stepsons, a stepdaughter, her mother, a brother and two sisters.

fun certainly does help make these months of short days and cold nights go by a little faster - or at least it tempers our ability to get through them.


Here's to 2017! May it bring good health, continued prosperity, and Classic good times!

so many of the details for our many outings and events of the past couple of years.



Meadowdale






Meadowdale International Raceway is located within Raceway Woods near the corners of Route 31 and Huntley Road in the far Northwest Corner of Carpentersville, IL. Meadowdale was a 3.27 mile road course racetrack which opened for its first race on September 14, 1958, only six months from the time construction permits were issued. The dream of Leonard W. Besinger, a commercial and residential property developer whose vision it was to make the track a destination in the national racing community, Meadowdale International Raceways operated from September 1958 through 1968 and is the only intact "ghost track" in the U.S.

The majority of the asphalt from the track still remains. The silo, which once displayed the Pure Oil logo, has been restored and stands at the Route 31 entrance as a symbol of what once was.

MIRPA's vision is to continue to promote and educate the community on the importance of Meadowdale International Raceways, which brought people to live and work in the area, providing a place to relax, recreate, and share stories and memories just as it does today.

"We seek to foster knowledge and appreciation of the American Motorsports Culture. To this end, we are currently gathering resources toward a future National Motorsports Museum and Resource Center." MIRPA hosts events throughout the year including the Meadowdale Motorsports & Memories Car Show, held on the old straight-away every September, an Annual Winter Banquet, a monthly Coffee & Cars gathering and special members only events like their annual dinner featuring speakers such as Bobby Unser, Al Unser, (Jr. and Sr), Lyn St. James, Bobby Rahal and Janet Guthrie.

Dates change for Milwaukee Concours

The Milwaukee Concours d'Elegance is moving to an earlier date in 2017 to avoid conflicts with other shows. The concours is set for the first weekend of August, a few weeks earlier than in the previous 12 years. The two-day event opens on Saturday, Aug. 5, with Show & Glow by the Lake, an open car show, as well as a motor tour and the annual Style & Speed Social. The Concours d'Elegance follows on Sunday, Aug. 6.

"We've been in direct conflict with Geneva (Illinois) Concours only 90 miles to the south," said Milwaukee Concours Co-Chair Carrol Jensen. "The Pebble Beach Concours is the third weekend of August, and it's a long drive to Milwaukee from California."

Concept Car Added to National Historic Vehicle Register

Added to the register earlier this year was The Buick Y-Job. When Harlow Curtice met with Harley Earl in 1934 Curtice, Buick's recently hired general manager, wanted to make the brand more appealing to younger, more stylistically inclined folks so he asked the head of GM's Art and Colour section to "design me a Buick you would like to own yourself." A few years later Curtice decided to fund a one-off advanced concept car. Called The Y-Job because Y represented "one step beyond" the X-prefixed cars of GM, The Y-Job Buick debuted in December 1939 as "The Car of the Future."

Over the years the car has spent time at the Sloan Museum, the Henry Ford in Dearborn, and since 1993 with the GM Design Center in Warren, MI.

Retro Cord May Be Coming Soon

With the passage of the Low Volume Motor Vehicle Manufacturers Act of 2015, Congress loosened the reins that have kept small manufacturers, like Cord, from recreating vintage classics from a bygone era. The redacted regulations will allow for a potential small increase in classic replica reproductions.


This Act allows small manufacturers (less than 5,000 cars annually) to construct up to 325 replicas per year for reproductions of automobiles over 25 years of age without meeting the exceptionally high industry standards for safety, emissions and the like.

Texas entrepreneur Craig Corbell is looking for venture capitalists to finance the reproduction of classic Cord motorcars and has announced his intention to reproduce the coffin-nosed Cord motorcars originally built at Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg in Indiana, perhaps as early as this year.

Corbell bought the rights to the Cord brand from the Prey family who reproduced Cord replicas and owned the name for the past 50 years.
