



### Greater Illinois Region Annual Dinner - November 15, 2015

Our speaker, Mitch Frumkin, has spent years covering the auto industry and the auto show circuit. As director of research and development for nearly 14 years at Publication International, Ltd., he was responsible for the development and photographic acquisition of more than 300 "Consumer Guide" publications and *Collectible Automobile* magazines.

He has authored four books: "Muscle Car Mania," "Son of Muscle Car Mania," "The Great Auto Trivia Book," and "Classic Muscle Car Advertising" and co-authored three: "World's Greatest Auto Show," "American Dream Cars," and "First to One Hundred – History of First 100 Chicago Auto Shows". His original automotive paintings and computerenhanced photographs have appeared in books and magazines.

Frumkin first began attending the Chicago Automobile Show as a car fan in the early '50s, and later as a founding member of the Midwest Automotive Media Association (MAMA). Since 1997, he has also been the photo archivist and historian for the Chicago Automobile Trade Association, sponsors of the show since 1935.

Before getting into publishing, Frumkin designed toys for Playskool, Ideal, and Kenner, and he holds several design patents. He is also the founder of Drive Communications, which provides new car evaluations and photography to buyers' guides and websites. He created and manages the Show History section of the Chicago Auto Show website, writes a regular column for *Old Cars Weekly* since 1997, and has a website, Vintage Quiz of the Week at http://www.vintageadoftheweek.com.

Langsdorf was a scientist on the Manhattan Project and Martyl was a well known artist. The home, located in Schaumburg, IL is on the National Register of Historic Places and is available for tours by appointment only.

### Jean Roche Receives AACA Award

On October 10, 2015 Jean Roche received her Senior Master Judging Award at AACA Hershey for obtaining more than 25 judging points. Jean is the first female in the Illinois Region to achieve this award.

She said while attending different meets Tom told her "If you really want to understand and appreciate the cars, you should learn to judge them". So she did. "It's not about who has the shiniest paint. I can no longer look at the cars without seeing the flaws, orange peel in the paint, how the doors and hood fit, authentic wiring, etc. It is very difficult for me to take points off for defects since I know how much work goes into restoring a car. But I know it's not fair to the other cars who are perfect, to overlook the defects."

"I have to admit I do enjoy it. I have seen and judged some magnificent cars and friendships have developed with some of the other judges who have been so helpful in teaching me the finer points of judging. I would strongly encourage other women to try it."

### Famed Route 66 to turn 90 in 2016

This year marks the 90th Anniversary of the highway made famous in literature, song and film. Officially established on November 11, 1926, it was removed from the United States Highway System on June 27, 1985, after it had been replaced in its entirety by segments of the Interstate Highway System. Portions of the road, often called 'America's Main Street', and 'The Mother Road', still exist however, and have been designated a National Scenic Byway of the name "Historic Route 66".

Car clubs, museums and towns in states all along the route are just some of the groups planning various types of celebrations to commemorate this anniversary year. One tour

operator is offering a 36 night package, even offering European participants the option of having their own cars shipped to the States for the event at a cost of slightly over \$16,000. Unlimited roadside assistance included.




