Auto Notes & News

News from Scottsdale

A couple of our members made the trip to the auctions in Scottsdale this January. Dan and Darlene Sobczyk as well as Bob and Bonnie Starzyk were in the Phoenix area for trips to the Barrett-Jackson, Bonham's, and Steele and Russo auctions.

Bob Starzyk noted that the number of Classics for sale is down - way down, indicating only about 1% of the cars crossing the auction block were Classics in his estimation. The hot trend in today's market is muscle cars and sports cars.





The fourth annual Arizona Concours d'Elegance, held in January on the grounds of the Arizona Biltmore, crowned the 1936 Bugatti 57SC Atlantic owned by Peter and Merle Mullin and Rob and Melani Walton as its Best of Show winner.

The magnificent hand-built car is notable for its prominent front fenders and a narrow aluminum body uniquely joined by rivets running along flanges atop its fenders and down its spine.

CHICAGO AUTO SHOW Wrap-Up

The nation's largest auto show grew by 55,000 sq ft this year - to 75,000 sq ft. where more than 20 vehicles made their world debut. Ford, Kia, Mazda and Subaru hosted outdoor test drives. and indoor tracks included Toyota's Highlander and RAV4 track, Fiat Chrysler Automobile's City Drive track and Camp Jeep.

Consumer voters selected their favorites in five categories in the "Best of Show" balloting. The Chicago Auto Show is the only major auto show that polls its attendees' favorite vehicles and exhibit.

Winners in the contest's five categories were:

- •Best All-New Production Vehicle: 2018 Ford Mustang
- •Best Concept Vehicle: LEGO Batmobile from Chevrolet
- •Best Green Vehicle: 2018 BMW 530e
- •Vehicle I'd most like to have in my driveway: 2018 Chevrolet Corvette

Planning is already underway for the 110th edition of the Chicago Auto Show. The 2018 show will open on Saturday, Feb. 10 and run through Monday, Feb. 19 - to take advantage of the Presidents Day holiday.

This item just made AARP's recent listing of 7 U.S. Museums for the Curious Traveler

The Gilmore Car Museum, Hickory Corners, Michigan

A small-town guy named Donald S. Gilmore started this collection of vintage cars 50 years ago, and now the Gilmore Car Museum is a key stop for auto geeks and nostalgia trippers. The museum displays some 400 cars and motorcycles, including rarities like the 1911 Stanley Steamer. You can also check out a re-created service station, circa 1930; a London double-decker bus and an authentic 1941 diner.





Not To Be Missed

For what is being described as an historical event, the AACA and the CCCA are holding a combined national meet in Auburn, IN, the classic car capitol of America.

Billed as the 'Triple Crown Meet', it coincides with Auctions America's Auburn Spring Weekend May 11 -13. Members who own full classic automobiles will be able to have their cars judged the same day and vie for their club's special awards as 100 or more cars come together for the event.

A yearly Spring tradition for collectors and enthusiasts across the country, Auctions America's Auburn Spring event is the first of the company's two annual Auburn sales. The weekend will also feature a 500-car auction, swap meet and car corral. Friday will see judging schools and seminars, followed by a free evening concert for club members and VIP guests.
