


Meet Kim Roberts

I'm a believer in driving the cars and keeping them on the road. If we can't do that we might as well collect paper weights...


Annual Dinner

Honored at this year's event was Bob Joynt who was presented with a Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of his significant contributions to the Classic Car Community.

Bob is a nationally known automotive historian with an encyclopedic knowledge. Involved with automobiles since he was a boy at age 14 he bought his first car, a 1932 Packard, which he still owns. Now retired from the First National Bank of Chicago, he is currently a Trustee of the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Automobile Museum in Auburn, IN, a judge at the Pebble Beach Concours, Master of Ceremonies for the Concours d'Elegance of America at St. John's, emcee at the Geneva Concours and a

past Director of GIRCCCA and board member of CCCA. As a volunteer docent with the Chicago Architecture Foundation, Bob can also be found giving architectural walking tours and Chicago River boat tours. Please join us in congratulating Bob for his many contributions.

News and Notes


The Packard Plant bridge over East Grand Boulevard in Detroit, one of the former auto plant's most recognizable features, collapsed onto the road below it on Wednesday, January 23.

Earlier that day some construction crews on the site reported bricks were falling from the bridge. Later in the day however, structural issues continued to mount, and the collapse occurred that afternoon. "We'd seen it leaking a little bit (of water) because it was already damaged a long time ago," a security guard reported. "You'd be scared to be underneath it."

The bridge is a joint property of Arte Express and the city of Detroit. Detroit owns the connected building south of the bridge. Arte Express has been trying to acquire the property under a development agreement.

The Packard Automotive Co. built the plant in 1903, but by 1954 the structure had become obsolete and Packard car production was being done elsewhere. Arte Express Detroit LLC, run by Peru-based developer Fernando Palazuelo bought the plant in a 2013 auction of foreclosed property. An attempted revitalization there is underway.

In summer 2017, Arte Express broke ground on its first phase to resurrect the facility. Today, it now faces foreclosure for hundreds of thousands of dollars in back taxes on the complex, just five years after purchasing it.
